The Port of Setúbal is a natural port located on the Sado Estuary that possesses natural conditions for maritime access and protection. It operates 24 h/day and 365 days/year. The importance of the Port of Setúbal goes back to pre-classic antiquity, known by the first Phoenician navigators that frequented our shores and established their commercial factories, as we can see in archeologically findings.
